In an effort to better engage the families within the 11,000-square-mile watershed represented by the middle Susquehanna (covering both the North and West branches) we are looking for songs inspired by the river.

This project is designed to achieve a number of goals, including the following:

- Offer a COVID-friendly and creative way to engage people throughout the watershed about the river's benefits and threats.
- Help musicians who have been impacted by cancelled gigs to show off their creativity, promote their skills regionally and get incentives.
- Develop a "paddling playlist" of songs that can be used at various Riverkeeper events and will be available via fundraising efforts for the Middle Susquehanna Riverkeeper.

## How to submit, rules and incentives ...

- All entries must be submitted to [mid-susriver@gmail.com](mailto:mid-susriver@gmail.com) by Jan. 31, 2021.
- Entry emails must include the song creator's name, age, hometown, title of the song and full song lyrics. An mp3 file of the completed song must be attached to the email.
- Lyrics must be family friendly and inspired by the Susquehanna River, focused on its benefits, addressing concerns or touching on some other river-based theme.
- The Middle Susquehanna Riverkeeper reserves the right to use the songs at various events, compile them in an album to raise money for association programming and other promotions. Artist will receive recognition in all uses.
- Submitted songs will be selected for our 2021 Songs of the Susquehanna official playlist based on their impactfulness. The most impactful songs will be selected by the association board of directors and via public feedback via our website.
- Most impactful songs will be featured in on-air radio promotions for the project and be eligible for a growing list of incentives donated by area businesses and individuals.
